## STIPULATION FOR SETTLEMENT

WHEREAS, Homes of Distinction, Inc. (hereinafter "Homes") filed an Appeal on November 30, 2000, challenging a Compliance Order issued by the Department of Environmental Protection (hereinafter "Department") on November 3, 2000, which Compliance Order, inter alia, required Homes to cease earth moving activities and to apply for an NPDES permit for storm water discharges related to construction activity; and

WHEREAS, Homes did cease earth moving activity and applied for said NPDES permit and on or about April 9, 2001, the Department granted an NPDES permit to Homes; and

WHEREAS, Homes has no further objections to the requirements of the Compliance Order, but wishes to preserve the factual and legal issues raised in its appeal should the Department seek civil or criminal penalties for the violations alleged in said Compliance Order; and

WHEREAS, the Department has indicated that it does not presently intend to seek penalties based on said Compliance Order, but does not object to preserving the issues raised in this appeal in the event that penalties should be sought.

NOW, THEREFORE, the parties stipulate to the entry of the following Order, if satisfactory to the Board, resolving this appeal:

The appeal of Homes of Distinction, Inc., is hereby dismissed without prejudice to the right of Homes to raise any and all factual or legal issues raised in the appeal docketed at Docket No. 2000-265-K in any proceeding seeking civil or criminal penalties for the violation alleged in the Department's November 3, 2000, Compliance Order.
